The below listed guidelines are to be followed for Fall 2020 Activities at the Miracle League of Arizona:

- Private Practice Sessions are limited to immediate family members/households only
 - A parent or guardian must accompany athlete for all activities at all times (unless own legal guardian(s) over 18 years of age)
- Temperatures will be taken upon entry for each individual, and temperatures that exceed 100.3 will not be permitted to enter
- Waiver must be signed by each family/group upon entry
- Masks/Face coverings are required, exceptions can be made for children under 5yrs only
- Sessions will be 30min and staggered to allow for time to clean the facility in between and avoid exposure of outside families
 - Guests will be required to stay in their cars until previous the family has left and have been given the OK by staff that the ballpark is ready to enter
- Each Miracle League player will be provided their own bat. Tees will be available for use.
- One bucket of balls per session, with an empty bucket for dirty balls to be placed afterwards. Throughout the day, there will be a rotating buckets and balls will be cleaned/disinfected in between.
- No helmets or gloves will be provided, but you are permitted to bring your own
- Staff will be on-site for supervision upon entry, however, will not be participating in the activity sessions.
- Only one care-giver restroom will be open
- The playground will be closed
- Drinking fountains will be closed
- The concession window will be available upon request for water, Gatorade, and merchandise only. No food will be available.
- Hands-free sanitizer stations will be located throughout the stadium at the entrance, in dugouts, and in the bathroom, and families will be encouraged to wash their hands often.
